PT Freeport Indonesia – Mitra Masyarakat Hospital (RSMM)

The health and wellbeing of the local community in Papua, especially in Mimika Regency where PT Freeport Indonesia (PTFI) operates, is a primary concern for PTFI and is thus a major component of PTFI's community development strategy. One of the most important positive impacts from PTFI's presence in Papua has been the provision of medical services and support for health initiatives carried out through partnerships with the Health Bureau of the Amungme and Kamoro Community Development Organization (LPMK)¹ and the government health agency.

Through the partnerships, PTFI funds two fully operational hospitals and seven primary health centers, which provide outpatient care and consultations totaling between 150,000 and 200,000 patient visits and inpatient care to more than 10,000 hospital patients each year.

One of the fully funded hospitals, Mitra Masyarakat Hospital (RSMM), has been providing primary health services since 1999. RSMM's services include mother and child care, treatment for infectious diseases, and handling trauma cases.

Mimika is one of the fastest-growing regencies in all of Indonesia. The area that only three decades ago supported only a few thousand individuals in scattered, isolated villages is now home to more than 200,000 people. As new residents arrive from across the province of Papua and the rest of Indonesia in search of employment and opportunity, the battle against diseases such as malaria, tuberculosis, and HIV/AIDS becomes more challenging. RSMM plays a critical role in helping the community address this challenge. RSMM was the only fully-functioning hospital in Mimika until November 2008, and it remains the primary healthcare destination for much of southern Papua and continues to operate nearly continually at or above full capacity and occupancy with its 101 beds.

RSMM also became the first hospital in Papua to receive accreditation from the Indonesian Ministry of Health last year. The accreditation was given after RSMM fulfilled five service criteria set by the Hospital Accreditation Committee (KARS) during their assessment in August 2008. The five service areas are administration and management, medical services, emergency services, nursing services, and medical record services.

While RSMM provides health services to indigenous Papuans virtually free of charge, RSMM implemented a new tariff scheme for medical services and costs to increase the long-term sustainability of the hospital. With the new tariff structure the non-sponsored community pays a premium for medical treatment which is then used to subsidize the cost of treating the sponsored Papuan community. The new tariff scheme allows RSMM to better serve the Papuan sponsored community and improve the long-term sustainability of the hospital.

¹ Lembaga Pengembangan Masyarakat Amungme Kamoro (LPMK), which means in English the Amungme and Kamoro Community Development Organization, is a nonprofit organization that aims to assist in the improvement of quality of life and human resources for those of the 7 Tribes (Amungme, Kamoro, Nduga, Dani, Damal, Moni, Mee) of Mimika Regency through development programs in the areas of education, health, economic development, and also support of activities implemented by traditional and religious organizations. A partner of PTFI, LPMK manages and monitors the PTFI community development partnership fund, which is used to develop and support the local community.

One of the hospital's primary functions is to provide a well-equipped and professionally staffed place for families expecting newborns. Since 2005 RSMM has served as a disease management center for HIV/AIDS in Mimika, providing people suffering from the illness an opportunity to receive treatment, medical information, and counseling. In 2007, 187 new HIV cases were diagnosed at RSMM including 11 pregnant mothers (of the 102 tested) with 8 of them enrolled in the Prevention of Mother to Child Transmission (PMTCT) program.

RSMM Rumah Sakit Pertama Terakreditasi di Papua

RSMM Becomes First Accredited Hospital In Papua

Rumah Sakit Mitra Masyarakat (RSMM) milik [Lembaga Pengembangan Masyarakat Amungme dan Kamoro \(LPSMAK\)](#) adalah rumah sakit pertama di Papua untuk memperoleh akreditasi dari Departemen Kesehatan (Depkes) Republik Indonesia. Akreditasi tersebut diserahkan secara langsung kepada Direktur RSMM dr. Paulus Sugiarto, S.Pd M.Kes di Gedung Direktorat Pelayanan Medis, Departemen Kesehatan, Jakarta (21/10). RSMM didanai oleh Dana Kemitraan bagi Pengembangan Masyarakat PT Freeport Indonesia (PTFI) melalui LPSMAK.

Akreditasi itu diberikan setelah RSMM dinyatakan memenuhi lima bidang pelayanan sebagai syarat yang ditetapkan oleh Komite Akreditasi Rumah Sakit (KARS) ketika mereka melakukan survei bulan Agustus lalu. Kelima bidang tersebut adalah administrasi dan manajemen, pelayanan medik, pelayanan gawat darurat, pelayanan keperawatan dan pelayanan rekam medik.



Dalam sambutannya ketika mengadakan syukuran di ruang pertemuan St. Michael RSMM Timika, Selasa (28/10), dr. Paulus Sugiarto mengatakan bahwa setelah melalui perjuangan keras, akhirnya RSMM memperoleh pengakuan atas kinerjanya. Direktur RSMM juga menyampaikan penghargaan atas peran penting para



Mitra Masyarakat Hospital (RSMM), a hospital owned by [Amungme and Kamoro Community Development Organization \(LPSMAK\)](#), became the first hospital in Papua to receive accreditation from the Indonesian Ministry of Health. The certificate was given to RSMM Director Dr. Paulus Sugiarto at the Ministry of Health offices in Jakarta (10/21). RSMM is funded by the PT Freeport Indonesia (PTFI) Partnership Fund for Community Development through LPSMAK. The accreditation was given after RSMM fulfilled five service criteria set by the Hospital Accreditation Committee (KARS) during their assessment in August 2008. The five service areas are administration and management, medical services, emergency services, nursing services, and medical record services.

In his remarks during a thanksgiving ceremony at the RSMM meeting hall on Tuesday (10/28), Dr. Sugiarto stated that through great effort RSMM has received acknowledgement of its performance. He also related his appreciation of the important role of stakeholders behind that success. "The sacrifices that we have made have brought about good and success for us all," he added.

"Semoga ke depan RSMM bisa menjadi rumah sakit mandiri yang bermutu dan menjadi tujuan berobat bagi para pasien di Provinsi ini," harapnya.

LPMak merupakan salah satu lembaga nirlaba yang bertujuan untuk membantu meningkatkan kualitas hidup dan sumber daya manusia serta kesejahteraan sosial ekonomi dari masyarakat asli yang berasal dari Tujuh Suku yaitu Amungme, Kamoro, Nduga, Dani, Damal, Moni dan Mee di Kabupaten Mimika melalui program pembangunan di bidang pendidikan, kesehatan, pengembangan ekonomi dan untuk mendukung kegiatan program yang dilaksanakan oleh lembaga-lembaga adat dan keagamaan.

LPMak adalah mitra PTFI yang dipercaya melakukan perencanaan dan pengawasan dalam rangka pemanfaatan dana kemitraan PTFI untuk pengembangan dan pemberdayaan masyarakat.

"We are proud to have a LPMak-owned hospital become the first hospital in Papua to receive accreditation from the government," said LPMak Deputy Executive Secretary II Emanuel Kemong on behalf of LPMak Executive Secretary John Nakiaya.

PTFI Vice President - Community Relations Demianus Dimara stated that the accreditation shows strong commitment by the community in supporting RSMM's mission and vision of service. The effort made is part of PTFI's social commitment as implemented by LPMak through Charitas Timika Foundation (YCT), which manages the hospital, and RSMM. "Going forward it is my hope that RSMM becomes an independent, quality hospital that is a medical destination for patients throughout Papua Province," he continued.

Dukungan PTFI terhadap RSMM

PTFI's Support of RSMM

Rumah Sakit Mitra Masyarakat (RSMM) adalah sebuah rumah sakit swasta dengan 101 tempat tidur yang dimiliki oleh Lembaga Pengembangan Masyarakat Amungme Kamoro (LPPMAK) dan dikelola oleh Yayasan Charitas Timika (YCT). Prioritas pelayanan kesehatan adalah upaya kesehatan ibu dan anak, penanggulangan penyakit infeksi terutama Malaria, Tuberkulosa dan HIV / AIDS, dan penanggulangan kasus gawat darurat terutama trauma dalam rangka *life-saving* dan *limb-saving*. RSMM memberikan pelayanan medis yang hampir bebas biaya untuk semua komunitas Tujuh Suku, dan pada tahun 2006 RSMM memfasilitasi sekitar 110.000 kunjungan pasien.



LPPMAK mengalokasikan Rp37 milyar untuk biaya operasional RSMM pada tahun 2006. Dalam tahun yang sama, Rp3,2 milyar dialokasikan untuk biaya kapital. Pada tahun 2006 PT Freeport Indonesia (PTFI) mengalokasikan lebih dari 47,5 juta dolar AS untuk program-program LPPMAK. Dari jumlah tersebut 21 juta dolar AS digunakan untuk program-program pengembangan dan sisanya diinvestasikan untuk penggunaan di masa depan.



Mitra Masyarakat Hospital (RSMM) is a 101-bed private hospital owned by the Amungme and Kamoro Community Development Organization (LPPMAK) and managed by Timika Charitas Foundation (YCT). Its primary health services include care of mother and child; handling of infectious diseases, especially malaria, tuberculosis, and HIV/AIDS; and trauma cases (life-saving and limb-saving). RSMM provides health services for all members of the Seven Tribes virtually free of charge, and in 2006 RSMM serviced around 110,000 patient visits.

operational expenditures was Rp 37 billion, with Rp 3.2 billion channeled for capital expenditures. In 2006, PT Freeport Indonesia (PTFI) provided over US\$47.5 million in funding toward LPMK's programs, of which US\$21 million went to development programs and the remaining funds were invested for future program use.

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
